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# 1. Executive Summary

Faith-based institutions have the greatest potential for direct community impact because they deal with both traditional and non-traditional families. This potential for direct community involvement is limited primarily due to the higher cost associated with broadcast media. The United Gospel Network, a DBA of Smith Chapel Apostolic Church, Inc. proposed broadcasting on Cable \_\_\_\_\_ is a viable solution. A membership broadcast program designed to reduce cost using the concept of Synergy, meaning, “the whole is greater than the sum of its parts.” Based on the synergy or cooperative action of faith-based institutions sharing in the cost, the chief barrier to gaining broader access to broadcast media, namely Comcast is reduced proportionately. The United Gospel Network is seeking a \$226,625.00 dollar grant to seed its first-year of operation. The Grant would cover only capital cost for the first year. A fully funded proposal initially consisting of annual contracts of pre-sold airtime to committed faith-based institutions plus Comcast Foundation funding would allow UGN – Network to air programming on Cable \_\_\_\_\_, as early as May 1, 2010.

UGN – Network Cable \_\_\_\_\_, Tallahassee Florida will serve as a forum for interracial and interdenominational faith-based communities to reach beyond races and religion for the greater good of humanity. UGN – Network (three-hour) six-day weekly Cable \_\_\_\_\_ broadcasting plans target the diverse culture of the Capitol of Florida, including tourist, students, and local residents. Programming will consist of live news and current events, educational services and bulletin board listings targeting at risk youth, panel discussions, ministry programs, as well as, internship opportunities for area students interest in a variety of careers in broadcasting or journalism.

Our aim is that by the end of the first-year to have over three-hundred faith-based institutions benefiting from Comcast Cable broadcasting thus exponentially affecting both their institutions and significantly increasing Comcast subscribers’ base.

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## 1.1 Funding Required

Our proposal is seeking a \$226,625.00 dollar grant to launch our UGN – Network on Cable \_\_\_\_\_ for studio lease, staff training and to purchase the required cameras and server equipment, including software and hardware for UGN – Network Studio.

In additional to Comcast Foundation funding, we are currently seeking, and additional \$50,000.00 in sponsorship fees, once collected will serve to enhance our recurring budget.

UGN – Network has access to a mailing list of more than six-hundred faith-based institutions, who have expressed interest in this proposal thus offering evidence of the need of broader broadcast access for the community at large.

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## 1.3 Statement of Need

The local yellow pages list more than four-hundred faith-based institution within the Tallahassee Comcast market. Less than ten percent utilize or have access to affordable broadcast media. This lack of affordable broadcast media limits cultural diversity and hampers community partnerships that may be used to combat teen pregnancies, low high school graduation rates, gang activity, and other juvenile crimes. If faith-based institutions, such as churches, synagogues or other non-profits have limited affordable access to media broadcasting, the winds of change will blow ever so slowly.

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## 1.4 Program Description

UGN – Network, in partnership with Comcast with a proposal to broadcast on Cable \_\_\_\_\_ beginning \_\_\_\_\_ - 2010 from its state of the art studio. The Network proposed to offer unique programming involving more that three-hundred faith-base institution, in Comcast local Tallahassee market. Starting with the first-year seed funding from Comcast Foundation, UGN – Network may aggressively launch its membership drive to secure more than one-hundred local faith-based institutions to join the Network. Foundation funding will be used to pay the first-year studio facility lease, staff training and to purchase the required cameras and server equipment, including software and hardware for UGN – Network Studio.

The desired outcome of UGN – Network is to facilitate community wellbeing by sharing both cultural and religious diversity using broadcast media serving both traditional and non-traditional families, with specific interest in breaking the cycle of youth destruction.

Bishop Will Pye, CEO will formally evaluate the project, to determine whether project objectives are being met, The evaluation Bishop Will Pye has proposed consists of two strategies for assessing project success:

### **A. Process Evaluation**

It is necessary to determine the church, ministries or individuals level of outreach prior to including their outreach using media broadcasting. It will also be necessary to ensure that participating ministries or their designees should expect to attend UGN Network broadcasting seminars monthly. If the evaluator determines that these conditions are not being met, he will advise the Project Director who will correct the problem.

- UGN Network Broadcasting Training or training provided from the local colleges or university will be used to augment the network broadcast and ensure a broader community appeal subject only to the content.

### **B. Outcome Evaluation**

To determine the extent to which the Comcast Channel \_\_\_\_\_aired on UGN Network is responsible for (1) increasing Comcast subscriber base (2) impacting families served by faith-based (3) adding to the overall diversity and wellbeing of our community Bishop Will Pye will collect extensive data on gathered from participants on the UGN Network. At quarterly intervals throughout the project period, Bishop Will Pye will report collected data for review by all participants.

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## 6. Future Funding

Despite the fact that most of the costs expenditures are on the capital acquisition and recurring cost for the first year, it will be necessary to plan for funding of certain aspects of the project. These costs include maintenance of technical equipment, periodic training of operators, including faith-based institutions. These costs are clearly fundable with net revenue as shown in the financial statements

The Division of Journalism offers instruction in broadcast journalism, newspaper journalism, magazine journalism, and public relations. The Division of Graphic Communication offers instruction in graphic design, photography, print production, and print management.

Each program has a professionally oriented curriculum that provides students practical assignments to help ensure their preparation for careers in their respective areas of study. Students also are exposed to the professional and ethical issues that relate to their fields.

Today, with 40 full-time faculty and adjunct instructors, nearly 600 undergraduate and graduate students, and several professional organizations, SJGC sets the standard in journalism and graphic communication for the 21st century and beyond.
